I hope you find the stories fun and whimsical while at the same time providing a good way to challenge your child to identify specific letters within a group of other letters.

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
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A is for Apple


(Read the story and circle all of the letter A's)

B is for Butterfly


(Read the story to your student then have them circle all of the letter B's)

C is for Caterpillar


(Read the story to your student then have them circle all of the letter C's)

D is for Dinosaur


(Read the story to your student then have them circle all of the letter D's)

E is for Elephant


(Read the story to your student then have them circle all of the letter E's)

G is for Gumball


(Read the story to your student then have them circle all of the letter G's)

H is for Hippo


(Read the story to your student then have them circle all of the letter H's)

J is for Jesus


(Read the story to your student then have them circle all of the letter J's)

J is for Jellybean


(Read the story to your student then have them circle all of the letter J's)

N is for Nest


(Read the story to your student then have them circle all of the letter N's)

P is for Pumpkin


(Read the story to your student then have them circle all of the letter P's)

S is for Snowman


(Read the story to your student then have them circle all of the letter S's)

V is for Valentine


(Read the story to your student then have them circle all of the letter V's)

X is for Xylophone


(Read the story to your student then have them circle all of the letter X's)

(Read the story to your student then have them circle all of the letter Y's)




Kitty plays with a yellow ball of yarn while a sleepy
