In this block, you will learn how to put a block on point, and chain piece. "On Point" simply means to turn a block $45^{\circ}$, and chain piecing means you don't cut your thread between blocks. This helps keep everything in the correct place.

Assemble the block as shown below. Make sure to press each row in opposite directions as shown by the arrows so that your seams nest.


Turn your block $45^{\circ}$ to the right. Use your 12-1/2" square ruler (or $6-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ square ruler) to trim your block to $12-1 / 2$ " $\times 12-1 / 2$ " or $6-1 / 2$ " $\times 6-1 / 2$ ".

TIP: Make sure all of your points are $1 / 4$ " from your cut line. I use the lines on my ruler to line up those tips!


Fun side note: You can keep adding squares until your granny square is any size you like! A larger one would be a perfect pillow or table topper!
