

Gauze Star Ornament



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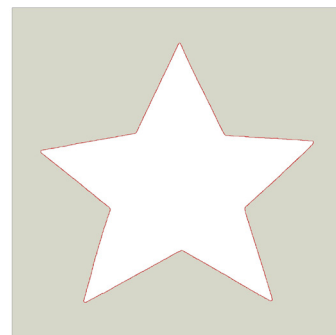
Supplies:

- Pinking Shears <https://amzn.to/47ETsxu>
- Scissors <https://amzn.to/3N9ScKA>
- Cotton Gauze Fabric <https://amzn.to/3t0ksZb>
- Needle and Thread

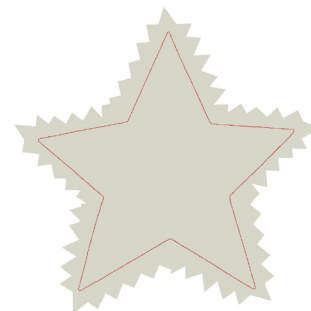
Directions:

Trace the star template on 3 to 4 layers of cotton gauze fabric.
The more fabric you layer, the thicker and squishier your stars will be!

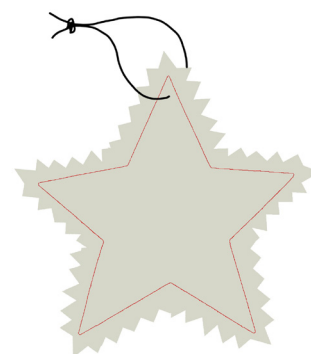
Next, machine sew or hand stitch along the drawn line.



Using pinking shears, trim about 1/4" away from the stitch line.
If you use regular scissors, your fabric will fray over time, which may also be a fun vintage look!



Thread a needle with a 10" piece of thread. Using the needle, draw the thread through one tip of the star ornament, then tie in a knot to create a hanger for your star.



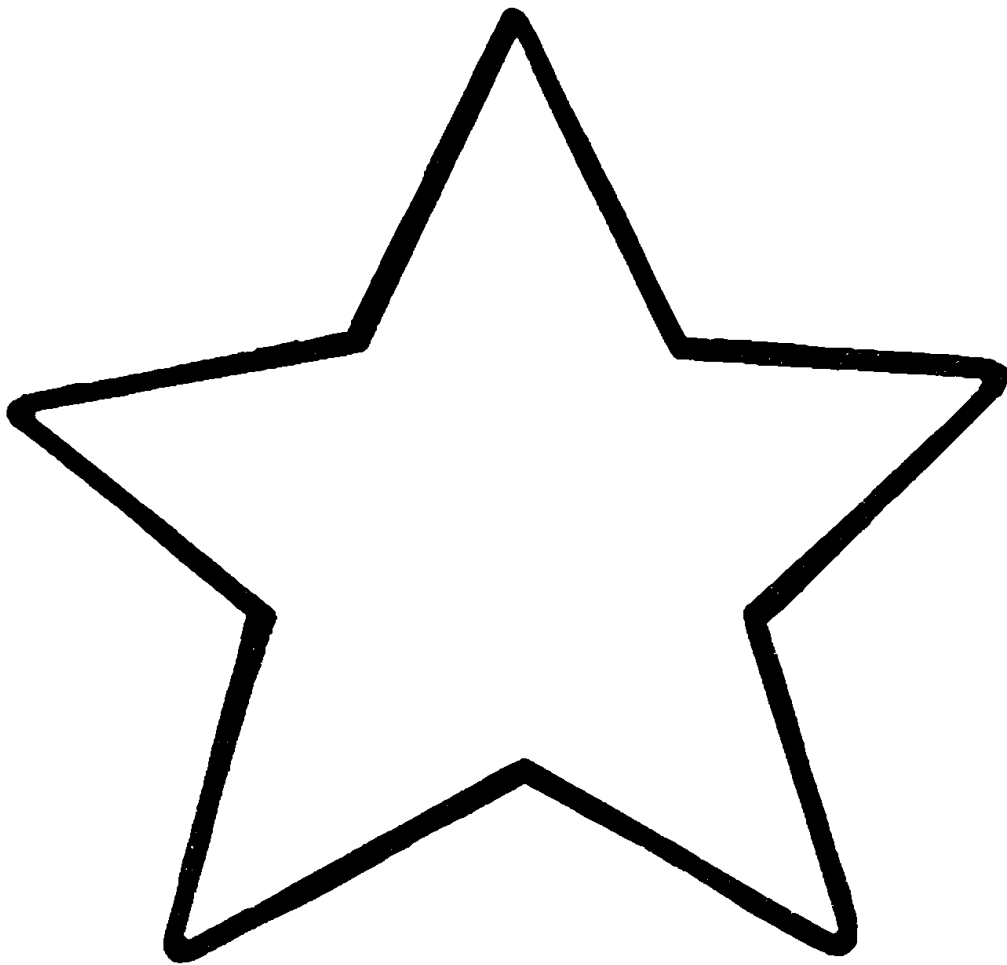
Finishing Ideas:

- Hang your finished stars on a tree
- Hang the stars on a piece of twine to create a garland for your tree, stair rail, or anywhere that needs a special holiday touch!
- Attach the star to a wrapped present!
